-information provided by Director Mitchell

-Question JR: what fund would relocating residual tenants come from?

-information provided by Director Mitchell

-Question JR: how have we rehoused people found to be in substandard housing?

A Mitchell: we have gotten people out of hotel/motels that are in situations where areas are unfit for human habitation.

Therefore we can relocate them with some of this funding. We tend not to get involved with relocation expenses of particular condominium or other housing complexes that are condemned.

-Additional information provided by Director Mitchell

-TT: I agree that this is something we should discuss further. The \$5M not expressly allocated in ERA seems to have provisions for relocation expenses. We should address dangerous dwellings that we know exist; that would go a long way in help toward this issue

-MDJ: there's various options we have including public private partnerships that could help us look at the situation and try to provide alternatives. That is something I'm looking at in the 5th district. Government cannot provide all because we don't have unlimited funds, but we do know the magnitude of the problems that exist in our community

-Question TT: are there percentages in this formula?

-it is input based on community needs

-TT: we spend a lot of money on public safety. Does it make sense to spend half of this project on police training facility renovations?

A Mitchell: the academy came to us, as they didn't have a specific funding source at the time. Additional information provided by Director Mitchell

-Question LJ: did you get additional funds through ARPA?

A Mitchell: we received an additional \$20M in 2021

-Question JR: when is this deadline for approval?

A Mitchell: the deadline to HUD is almost immediately; it's statutory and we have to get it in immediately. That date is the first week in August

-Question JR: under public services, how many applications were rejected?

A Mitchell: 1 agency was rejected because they didn't meet the minimum threshold

-Question JR: regarding the police academy, why are we not using public safety allocation out of SPLOST?

A Mitchell: my understanding is that the academy was appropriated \$180,000 out of requested funding. That is not enough alone for an academy

-Z Williams: my recollection is that we had Planning money aside around \$250,000

JR: There may be some funding left over in SPLOST that we could explore

-Question JR: are we fully exploiting our administrative?

A Mitchell: yes

-Question JR: under the HOME program, I'd be interested in knowing how that HOME money is going out.

-MDJ: we are not in a perfect world and we unfortunately have to deal with bureaucracy. What we're trying to do is protect our citizens about not enough police. Public safety is still #1 in my district, and they also appreciate Black Lives Matter. People want to be safe in their community, they want public safety in their community, they want us to be aware of the disparities when they are stopped by the police. We have to tell our children what to do and what to expect. If we don't have the training needed, then we will get more calls.

-Question TT: I want to put a marker back on investing in public benefits navigators. There is efficacy in honing in on the areas where we know the highest levels of violent crime are.
